

Super Tuesday Election Tips from the Town Clerk:

1. Concord is holding **TWO** elections on March 6th – one for the Presidential Primary and one for the Annual Town Election.
2. The number of votes you are allowed to cast for each vacancy is noted on the ballot. Be sure to vote for the proper number of candidates for each vacancy—if you fill in more circles than there are vacancies, your vote will be counted as a blank.
3. On the Presidential Primary Ballot, for Town Committee you have a choice of either voting for the Group (which includes all of the individual names listed on the ballot under the “Group”) or you may vote for individual candidates, up to a maximum number allowed (24 maximum for Republican and 35 maximum for Democrat).
4. On the Town Election Ballot, please take note of the number of vacancies for each position:
 - Moderator – one vacancy – vote for not more than ONE
 - Board of Selectmen – two vacancies – vote for not more than TWO
 - School Committee – two vacancies – vote for not more than TWO
 - Concord Housing Authority – one vacancy – vote for not more than ONE
5. If you wish to vote for a candidate(s) whose name(s) is not printed on the ballot, write in the candidate’s name and address in the blank provided **AND** fill in the oval. If you have a sticker for a write-in candidate, you may apply it directly to the ballot, making sure that the oval is also filled in.
